# 9. INNOVATION UPDATE

Brecknell Willis are still to complete their project. Due to unforeseen circumstance, BW will no longer be installing their OLE at the Wednesbury depot, but will instead install it at Long Marston, where the ground works have been completed to install a live test track for the industry.

We are also working with the DISC project with Edinburgh trams and the project is progressing well.
