
Thank you for joining us for this key event on the UKTram calendar and, together, we hope we can create a platform which demonstrates that this really is light rail's time.





The Venue

We can't wait to welcome you to this year's Light Rail Summit on Thursday 23rd September 2021. Edinburgh Trams have kindly allowed delegates free tram travel throughout their stay, including transfers from Edinburgh Airport. A separate tram pass has been sent with this email. You can print the pass out before you travel or just show it on your phone, if asked by a member of Edinburgh Trams staff.



The Summit venue is The Edinburgh Grosvenor Hotel and can be found at **5-21 Grosvenor Street, Edinburgh. EH12 5EF** and is conveniently situated next to Haymarket rail station and tram stop. A contact telephone number of the hotel is **0131 226 6001**

Once inside the reception area, follow the signs to The Roseberry Suite.

The walk will remain on the public highway and there will be no access to any worksites, so protective clothing is NOT required. Delegates can walk as far down the route as they wish, numerous Lothian bus services run back to the city centre and link with the tram at York Place or Princes Street.
